Applied Learning Morning

On Wednesday 15th March students across all year groups were given the opportunity to engage in learning outside of their usual curriculum.

Post 16

Students engaged in sessions planned in response to their feedback on what topics they would like to cover. Sessions focussed on thinking about their future lives, finance and preparation for exams. Sessions were led by both school staff and the organisation 'Resilient Me'.





Year 11

Students visited Plymouth University where they took a tour of the campus and learned about what it was like to be a student. As part of our careers programme we en-

sure that all students have had the opportunity to visit a University before they move on to Post 16. Students are taught in school about some of the opportunities available to them if they want to aspire to higher education, but this provides them a first-hand experience which we hope will inspire many to consider this route for their future.

Years 7-10

Students participated in a careers focused morning, with all students attending workshops with two different employers or training providers. With 17 different employers and training providers volunteering their time to work with our students, there was a great feeling of community within the school. Employers fed back that students were engaging well with the workshops and asking really interesting questions. Several students reported that they were now considering different future careers because of a workshop that they attended.

Trips & Workshops

Providing a variety Careers focused trips and workshops enables us to ensure that students are experiencing a wide variety of opportunities to support them in considering options for their future. This term we have provided the following:

Year 11 Trip to Plymouth University Science & Engineering Showcase

We were delighted to be able to offer students in Year 11 the opportunity to attend the Science & Engineering Showcase at Plymouth University on Friday, 20th January.

Students in Year 11 are currently thinking about what they will go on to study after they finish their GCSEs, and this was offered to support those students who had expressed an interest in studying Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics (STEM) subjects in the future. We hope that this experience will encourage students to further consider careers in STEM areas and increase their knowledge of the wide variety of opportunities available to them.

From robotics to chemistry and marine life to computing, interactive displays demonstrated how staff, students, researchers, partners and professionals are collaborating to impact everyday lives. Our students were great at getting involved and used this as an opportunity to ask all their questions about university and STEM opportunities.



Years 9-12 Oxford University Workshops

Students achieving exceptionally high academic standards across years 9-12 were invited to take part in workshops being delivered by the outreach team from Exeter College, Oxford. These were very well attended sessions and students gained a greater insight into what university life is like and specifically what Oxford has to offer to students.

Years 12 & 13 Trip to Cardiff University

Students were given the opportunity to travel to Cardiff University to gain an insight into what university has to offer. They engaged in lectures and a tour of the campus with student ambassadors who were able to offer their insights into university life.

Students were then given free time to explore the city to provide them with an opportunity to see what a Capital City university has to offer in terms of local facilities and location.



Trips & Workshops

Year 11 Construction Open Site Visits

Students in Year 11 considering an apprenticeship in the construction industry as their next step, were given the opportunity to visit either Boringdon Spa Hotel or Sherford construction sites.

They were given tours of the sites and learned about what employers were looking for in their apprenticeship applications. Several of our students initiated conversations with employers and are now using these contacts to support their apprenticeship applications.





Year 12 UCAS Discovery Exhibition 2023 Trip

Year 12 students are now starting to think about what they plan to do once they finish 6th Form. Students will move onto university, apprenticeships and employment in September 2024 and will be supported to consider all of their options in order to identify the best pathway for them.

UCAS Discovery exhibitions bring together the experts to help students shortlist their options, all under one roof. Year 12 students were given the opportunity to:

- meet over 100 unis, colleges, and apprenticeship employers face-to-face
- find out about different options and pathways
- listen to live expert talks
- get the latest advice and information on different career choices.
