Title of event: Theology and Religion Discovery Day

Date: Thursday June 6th, 2024

Approx. timings: 10.30-2.30

Details of event (with schedule and session titles to follow later):

What would it be like to study Theology and Religion at university? This day gives students an opportunity to learn more about the impact of religion on the world today, and its interactions with politics, gender, and contemporary questions. Students will learn from academic experts on topics such as feminism and religion, philosophical understandings of free will, ethics and the environmental crisis, and religion and the media. Students also have an opportunity to learn more applying to university and contextual offers; student life and the transition to university, whether they're living at home or moving away for the first time; and where studying Theology and Religion might take them. Students will also have the opportunity for a campus tour.

This day will be of particular interest to students taking RE, RS or Philosophy, but is also open to those with no background knowledge in these subjects.

School groups welcomed. Year 12 and older students may attend alone. If there are enough of you we can look at running it as a trip, but we will need names by the end of April for that.

Oxbridge Applicants

For Students:

These sessions are aimed at Year 12 students who may be considering making an application to Oxford or Cambridge, and would like to find out more about student life and the admissions process. Younger students are more than welcome to attend if it would be helpful. We recommend that students attend both sessions, as they offer different insights into Oxbridge. Sutton Trust Summer Schools

Our <u>UK Summer Schools 2024</u> are now open for applications.

Giving state-school pupils a fantastic opportunity to learn about what life is like at one of 13 leading UK universities, our Summer Schools are a key part of our programmes offering. Students on these programmes will spend a week living in halls, taking part in academic sessions, meeting young people with similar interests, and gaining valuable insights into the world of higher education.

In addition to our Summer Schools, we are also now accepting applications for our <u>Access Apprenticeship</u> programme. This programme offers state-school pupils the chance meet employers and like-minded peers, and learn more about how to access top apprenticeships. The programme is one year long, with students able to learn more about one of three different apprenticeship sectors, depending on their location: Banking and Finance (London based), Engineering (Birmingham based), and Law (London based).

Applicants to these programmes must be studying in Year 12 in England or Wales, Year 13 in Northern Ireland, or S5 in Scotland (or equivalent), and have always attended a state-funded school. Applications close around mid-March.

University of Cambridge Homerton College Essay Programme (May-July)

Aimed at students in Year 12 England/Wales, Year 13 Northern Ireland, and S5 Scotland, this programme is intended to equip participants with key skills such as critical reading, research design and essay writing. Students will have access to a selection of subject-specific and skills-based webinars from May to July, which will provide you with the grounding to devise and produce your own essay in response to a choice of questions. Prizes will be given, and participants will have the opportunity to attend Homerton College's Sustainability Student Conference and/or Residential. **Deadline to apply is 1st May.**

<u>University of Cambridge "Apply: Cambridge" Programme</u> (July 2024-January 2025)

Apply: Cambridge is a free programme to support high-attaining students from underrepresented backgrounds and areas to make successful applications to the University of Cambridge. Uni of Cambridge will work with you every step of the way over a 6-month period, helping you navigate the process and effectively prepare for your Cambridge application. You will have access to informational webinars, workshops, supercurricular learning opportunities, Q&A sessions and mentoring from a current Cambridge student. **Applications open in April 2024.**

Wadham College Oxford Summer Schools (August 2024)

Wadham runs five-day residential summer schools each August for Year 12 pupils in UK state schools or sixth-form colleges, designed to give Year 12 students a taste of what it's like to be an undergraduate at the University of Oxford. Pupils will take part in an academic programme, live in College, meet student ambassadors studying at Oxford, and receive information, advice and guidance on applying to university. The Summer Schools are free - accommodation and meals are provided by the college, and financial support is available to pupils to cover travel costs. **Application deadline is 3rd May. London**

<u>University of London Taster Courses</u> (book now!)

London universities (King's College London, Queen Mary University of London, University College London and London School of Economics and Political Science) come together to provide Year 12 students with one-day or half-day courses, allowing students to gain an insight into studying a particular subject or subject area at university.

Join Imperial College London for a glimpse into the life of a Geology, Geophysics or Planetary Science student at Imperial. Enjoy interactive in-person sessions, chat to current students, hear from top
