

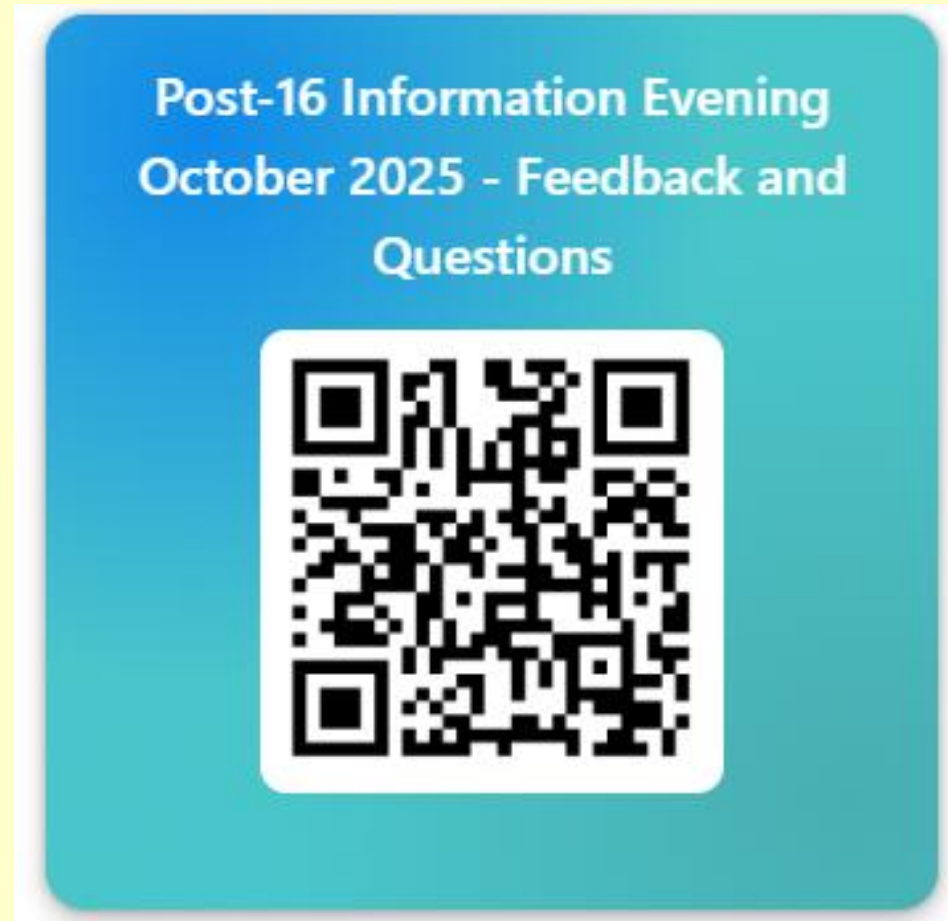

High Expectations and High Levels of Support

Attendance 'Rules':

- Students must attend **all lessons, study sessions, assemblies and tutor sessions** promptly as timetabled.

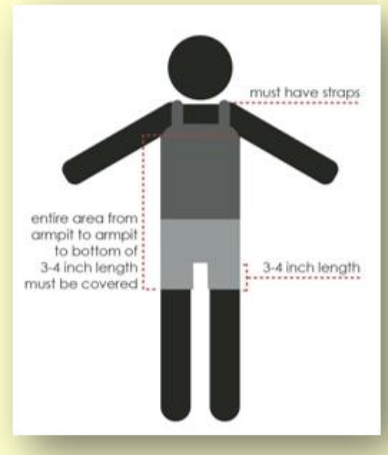


High Expectations and High Levels of Support

5 choices (*approximately the same field of study*)

Our advice:

1x Aspirational choice –you might get this, if you really work hard

1x Back up choice, which is **LOWER** than your aspirational choice

3x others, somewhere between the two

UCAS entry requirements

There are two types of offers:

1. A **grade-based offer** (e.g. ABB at A Level)
2. **UCAS points** (e.g. 120): any combination of grades

Consistency, focus, organisation (life skill!), safeguarding.

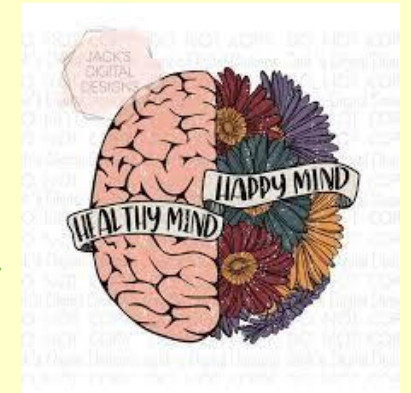
Sometimes, with the best intentions, we can try to help and actually make it worse in the long run.
