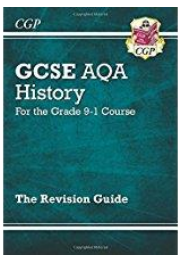

1. Books

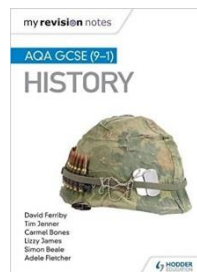

My Revision Notes: AQA GCSE (9-1) History Paperback – released on 24 Nov 2017 (about £9)

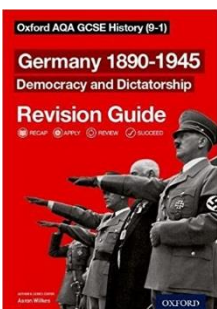

However, if you are able to buy them all they would be very good resources to have.

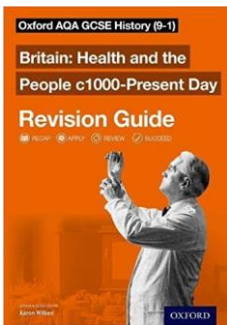

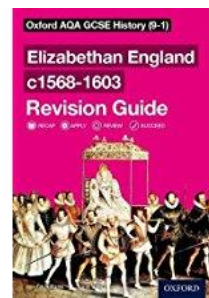

Health and the People (Medicine Through Time)

- a) **BBC Teach Medicine Through Time.** Log onto youtube, then search for *BBC Teach Medicine Through Time*. There should be 10 separate videos on different periods of the study. These videos act as a good way back into revision, but do not contain everything on the syllabus.
- b) **Revise GCSE History.** A teacher has put some videos together under the username **Revise GCSE History** (<https://www.youtube.com/channel/UC2mVH746vKTDEBBTRpmPDHQ>). Only 4 of his videos are relevant: 'Medieval Medicine'; 'Renaissance Medicine'; '1750-1900'; '20th Century Medicine'.
- c) **Medicine Through Time Bitesize Revision** video. This is a very old video made by the BBC from an old syllabus, but it's still useful. Everything is relevant from about 30 minutes onwards, although knowledge of prehistory and the ancient world (first 30 minutes) would be good background knowledge anyway.

Elizabethan England

- a) **BBC Teach - Time Traveller's Guide to Elizabethan England.** These videos are available on Youtube. They are not directly related to the syllabus but are useful background information for widening knowledge.
- b) **David Starkey Elizabeth documentaries.** If you type David Starkey Elizabeth into Youtube there are 4 good documentaries that cover her entire life. (From Prison to Palace; The Virgin Queen; Heart of a King; Gloriana)
- c) **youtube – The History Teacher** has various videos that focus on Elizabethan England.

3. Websites

- **BBC Bitesize** has lots of resources on each topic. Go to the GCSE England section and click on History, then AQA. Only the **Elizabethan England** and **Germany** topics are currently available, but they are updating the site so this could change. Includes revision tests.
- **Mr Alsop History.** Contains podcasts and other information on the **Germany** and **International Relations** topics. Lots of detail and lots of links.
